EDITORIAL CORRESPONDENCE.

SECOND LETTER.

At Sea, May 13, 1870.

Here we are on the broad Atlantic, about 1,600 miles from New York.

Nothing of any particular note occurred either on Friday or Saturday.

Monday night (9th), while passing the banks of Newfoundland, our ship was completely surrounded with mackerel...

Tuesday was quite an eventful day. In the morning the wind was comparatively quiet, and the cabin passengers, together with the captain and doctor, spent some time in dancing.

Wednesday.—The sea has been a trifle calmer, though the swells are still very high.

Friday and Saturday passed with but little worth of note. The weather quite cold, as it has been nearly all through the voyage.

ADVANTAGES OF THE STEERAGE. First.—If you want companions while on board, you can have a larger number to select from than you could were you in the cabin.

Second.—You are taught to be industrious as steerage passengers have to wash themselves and their dishes.

Third.—You are less liable to be sea-sick, as your fare is plain, and as you are not prone to overeat the stomach, as are cabin passengers.

steerage passage should be preferred; still we are inclined, on our return home, to try the cabin.

Sunday was a fine day, and quite interesting on account of an Episcopal service in the cabin.

To-day (Monday) is the most beautiful of the whole voyage, and the passengers are feeling delighted at the prospect of reaching Queenstown to-night and Liverpool to-morrow night.

Wednesday morning.—Here we are, after a somewhat tedious voyage, in Liverpool, and though feeling somewhat fatigued, yet in good spirits, feeling greatly delighted in stepping on the shores of "Merry England."

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Third.—You are less liable to be sea-sick, as your fare is plain, and as you are not prone to overeat the stomach, as are cabin passengers.

Fourth.—There are more babies in the steerage, and babies make music, especially at midnight, and who does not like music?

Fifth.—You have nice hard beds (or no beds at all), and hard beds are said to be conducive to health.

Sixth.—The rooms in the steerage being closely packed with passengers (some of whom have a great liking for herrings and onions), conduces to warmth, if not to the pleasantness of the atmosphere, and warmth is very desirable on a cold night.

Seventh.—The above are a few of the reasons why a steerage passage should be preferred; still we are inclined, on our return home, to try the cabin.
