Henry J. Raymond, the founder and editor-in-chief of the New York Times, died suddenly on Friday morning last of apoplexy in the fiftieth year of his age.

He spent the last afternoon of his life at Greenwood Cemetery in selecting a family burial place, went to his office for business, thence home to rest and to a political meeting in the evening.

Returning from that he reached his house and on entering fell helpless under the mighty blow which soon ended to noble life.

A man of tireless working powers, of great energy and unquenchable memory, he had acquired a vast amount of political and general knowledge which has shown forth abundantly in the great journal he founded and which will perpetuate his memory.

Mr. Raymond was a democrat, Whig, and republican of consequence a Republican. Failing to lead in some measure honestly intended for the good of the country, he lost influence with many of his party, but he believes he was a true patriot, working sincerely by what he thought the best means for the good of the nation and mankind.
