On Wednesday afternoon the first brief debate of the session took place both in the Senate and Honse. In the Senate it was upon a bill amending the charter of the Vermont Life Insusance Company at Burlington, in such manner as to exempt its assets from taxation. Such a provision, does exist in the charter of the National Life Insurance Company at Montpelier, and the new company were seeking to be placed on an equal footing. The general committee reported the bill. Senator Pingry expressed himself as opposed to the bill on general principles of exempting assets of such companies from taxation, as they often accumulate large amounts, and they should not be privileged by legislation over other property.

Senator Benedict, who introduced the bill and explained the object of the bill to be to retain capital in the State, and place it upon an equal footing with other similar associations, and especially that discrimination should not be made against a new company just struggling into existence. He thought it was becoming the policy of the State to encourage capital to come into the State, and this was indicated by the legislation of last year, in exempting new manufacturing property, and thought the same encouragement should be given to insurance companies and enable our people to insure at home, and prevent the export of money from the State.

Mr. Gardner was ready to leave the question of general taxation open, but Mr. Pingrey, however, thought the best way to place the two companies upon an equality, was to repeal that provision of the charter of the National Company which exempts its assets from taxation, and accordingly introduced a bill for that pur-
